## ***Whitening Pet Hair with MSB and Removal of Excess Bluing from Pet Hair***

**Whitening Pet Hair:** To whiten a pet, our customers tell us that they begin by washing and rinsing their pet as usual. Then, they dilute a "few" or a "couple" drops of Mrs. Stewart's® Bluing in 1-2 quarts of water and run the diluted bluing through their pet's hair as the final rinse.

**Facts about MSB:** MSB is basically a blue iron powder suspended in water and contains a non-toxic amount of a biocide and pH balancer. Even in its concentrated form, MSB is non-toxic, biodegradable and environmentally friendly. MSB is manufactured under non-sterile conditions and is therefore, not generally recommended for ingestion by human or animal.

**Disclaimer:** MSB is manufactured and tested as a laundry whitener only. All other uses are "at your own risk". While we advertise MSB for some other uses, we try to remain clear that these other uses come to us from loyal customers and we pass the information on as a public service.

**Removal of Excess Bluing from Pet Hair:** When someone uses too much bluing on fabric, our recommendation is for them to soak the fabric, airtight, in a container of water & ammonia overnight - 72 hours. Obviously, you cannot do this with your pet.

Others who have found themselves in your situation have told us that continuous washing will eventually remove the bluing ... one customer said that after trying several soaps, Dawn Dishwashing Liquid worked the best. Since bluing is not a permanent dye, this makes sense to us. Dog owners often recommend a good grooming and hair cut. Others have observed that sunlight seems to fade it a bit ... those that walk their animals outside seem to see the blue fade faster. Unfortunately, no one seems to have come up with a better solution. If you do, please let us know so that we can pass the information on to others.
